TUITION AND FEES

Students taking Dual Enrollment courses on MTC campuses are responsible for the cost of tuition and books. However, they may be eligible for SC Lottery Tuition Assistance Program (LTAP), and South Carolina Workforce & Industrial Needs Scholarship (SC WINS) funding. Students will be responsible for tuition and fees not covered by these aid programs. The cost of Dual Enrollment courses on high school campuses is coordinated between the college and the school district. Students should check with their high school for course options and costs.

Students must complete the South Carolina Lottery
Tuition Assistance Program form and take at least six
college credit hours to receive assistance. The form can
be found at MIDLANDSTECH.EDU/admissions/forms.

Upon successful course placement, Dual Enrollment students may take any course MTC offers, with selected options for classes taken on a high school campus. Some of the subjects include:

Math: college algebra | trigonometry | pre-calculus | calculus | statistics






