### 2020-21 School Opening

- ► Regular instruction will begin Monday, August 17, 2020
- ➤ Due to safety guidelines, we are not able to serve 3K until we return to a traditional model
- ► Parents may choose between two options for students in 4K 12<sup>th</sup> grade

### **Instructional Program Choices**

- ► Choice 1 Virtual Instructional Program

  Enrolled students commit to remain in virtual learning until Lexington 4 returns to a traditional model
- Choice 2 Hybrid Instructional Program Schools will begin at the 2 Day A-B Hybrid Instructional Stage.
  - Stages will change based on our ability to maintain social distancing and safety guidelines in response to COVID spread conditions and availability of staff

### Virtual Instructional Program Foundational Items and Structure

- ► Recommended daily work schedule
- ▶ Daily attendance requirements
- Scheduled quizzes and tests
- ► Follows Lexington 4 Grading Policy and Academic Calendar

### Virtual Instructional Program Personal Teacher Advisor

- ► Daily contact with student
- ► Verifies daily attendance
- ► Monitors student work plans
- ► Facilitates individualized assistance for students from assigned content teachers

# Virtual Instructional Program Teaching & Learning

- ➤ Virtual Support & Monitoring from Lexington 4 teachers in each course
  - ► Teacher office hours
  - Live streaming and recorded lessons
  - Personalized feedback

- ► E-Learning curriculum
- ► Primary learning management platforms
  - **K4** 4<sup>th</sup>: Otus
  - ► 5<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup>: Google Classroom
  - ▶9<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup>: VirtualSC

# Virtual Instructional Program Meals, Activities, & Athletics

- ➤ Student meals may be picked up at designated district locations.
- Students may participate in athletics and extracurricular activities

- ▶ 2 days of on-campus instruction weekly
  - Small-group guided instruction
  - ► In-person support & monitoring
  - In-class assessment of learning
  - Core-Course Focus (ELA, Math)

- ▶ 3 days of virtual instruction weekly
  - Recommended daily schedule
  - ► Independent practice of skills
  - Assigned reading & writing

- ➤ On-campus days staggered to support consistent student learning.
  - A Purple Cohort: Mon and Wed
  - **B Gold Cohort**: Tue and Thu
  - Specialized Groups: Friday(ex. CATE courses, AP Courses, Exceptional Children)

- ► E-Learning curriculum supplemented by in-class responsive teaching
- ► Daily attendance requirements
- ► Follows Lexington 4 Grading Policy and Academic Calendar

# A-B Hybrid Instructional Program Student & Staff Safety

- ► Full-time social distancing to the extent possible
- ► Frequent hand sanitization
- ► Daily disinfection of rooms and buses

# A-B Hybrid Instructional Program Student & Staff Safety

- ► All staff wear masks in the presence of students
- ► Students in grades 3 and up wear masks at all times
- ► 4K to 2nd grade students wear masks to extent possible

# A-B Hybrid Instructional Program Student & Staff Safety

- ▶ Limited student in-school transitions
- ➤ Students diagnosed with COVID19 or identified as having close contact exposure will be transitioned to full virtual instruction through their quarantine or treatment period

# A-B Hybrid Instructional Program Meals, Activities, & Athletics

- ► Students will eat on-campus meals in the classroom or other managed spaces
- ► Take-home meals for virtual learning days will be distributed to students each on-campus day
- Students may participate in athletics and extracurricular activities

### Virtual & Hybrid Instructional Programs Common Features

- ► Foundational e-learning curriculum aligned to SC State Standards for all courses
- ▶ Daily teacher support and monitoring of student attendance and work
- ► Common assessments for all courses; common grading policy and academic calendar
- Student accessibility to daily meals, athletics and extra-curricular activities

# **Hybrid Instructional Program Continuum**Deciding Factors

- Multiple factors may result in modifications to the Hybrid Instructional Program at a <u>specific school</u> or <u>across the entire</u> <u>district</u>
- ► Internal factors:
  - Student enrollment in the Virtual Instructional Program
  - ► Health conditions impacting the presence of available staff
- External factors:
  - Changes in DHEC safety guidelines involving social distancing on buses or at school
  - Governor's Executive Order mandating a change to school schedules

# **Hybrid Instructional Program Continuum**Four Stages

- ► Stage 1: All Virtual
- ► Stage 2: 1 Day Weekly Hybrid
- ► Stage 3: 2 Days Weekly A-B Hybrid
- ► Stage 4: 5 Days Weekly Hybrid

Due to current social distance guidelines in schools and on district transportation, our highest possible hybrid opening stage is 2 Days Weekly A-B Hybrid (Stage 3)

### **Hybrid Instructional Program Continuum**All Virtual

- ► Change from A/B Plan: All students participate in the virtual instructional program
- Program option of "last resort"
- ► May be required if:
  - Staff availability limits ability to adequately supervise students
  - Disease spread is extreme
  - ► Governor's office mandates closure
- ▶ 5 days of virtual instruction weekly

### **Hybrid Instructional Program Continuum**

- 1 Day Weekly Hybrid
- ► Change from 2 Days Weekly A/B Plan: Fewer students attend in-person each day with fewer on-campus days.
- ▶ 1 day of on-campus instruction weekly
- ► 4 days of virtual instruction weekly

### **Hybrid Instructional Program Continuum**

1 Day Weekly Hybrid

#### **On-Campus Instructional Focus**

- Assessment and accountability
- Monitoring student attendance and completion of weekly assignments
- Small-group instruction with essential core content

### Factors Requiring 1 Day

- ► Low student enrollment in Virtual Instructional Program requiring more cohorts to meet safety guidelines
- Reduction in available staff that results in having to strictly limit student daily attendance
- ► Changes in DHEC safety guidelines

- ► Current district opening stage
- ► Scheduled to begin on August 17, 2020

- ▶ 2 days of on-campus instruction weekly
- ▶ 3 days of virtual instruction weekly
- 2 Student Cohorts plus Specialized Groups
- ► Purple Cohort: Monday and Wednesday
- ► Gold Cohort: Tuesday and Thursday
- Specialized Groups: Friday
   (ex. CATE courses, AP Courses, Exceptional Children)

### **On-Campus Instructional Focus**

- ► Small-group guided instruction
- ► In-person support and monitoring
- ► In-class assessment of learning
- ► Core Course Focus (ELA, Math)

### Factors Requiring 2 Day A-B Hybrid

- ► Moderate student enrollment in Virtual Instructional Program
- ► Meeting DHEC and CDC safety guidelines for social distancing on buses and in-class based on student program enrollment

- ► Change from 2 Days Weekly A/B Plan: All hybrid students attend on-campus each school day.
- ▶ 5 days of on-campus instruction weekly

#### **On-Campus Instructional Focus**

- ▶ Dependent on student enrollment and social distancing requirements
- ► Fewer On-Campus Students / Less Social Distancing Requirements: Allows more whole-class instruction and student transitions
- More On-Campus Students / Current Social Distancing Requirements: Requires more virtual instruction and eliminates transitions

### Factors Allowing and/or Requiring 5 Days

- ► Reduction of social distancing requirements
- ► High enrollment in Virtual Program requiring fewer cohorts to meet safety guidelines
- Executive Order mandating daily attendance for all students
